Make Employment Injury Insurance a Reality



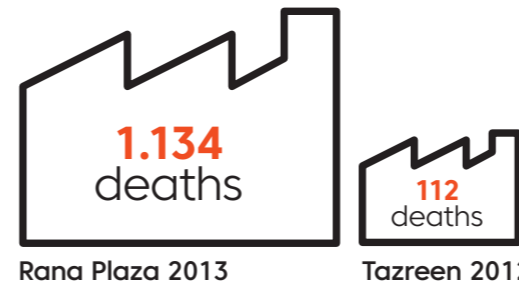
Bangladesh is the **2nd largest** exporter of clothing world-wide



Compensation for a workplace injury or death is a **fundamental right** for all workers



Some of the worst garment factory disasters happened in Bangladesh



These workers received compensation through a private arrangement



Brands and governments signed a **letter of intent** to establish national employment injury insurance



An **employment injury insurance** system will only cost

0.3%

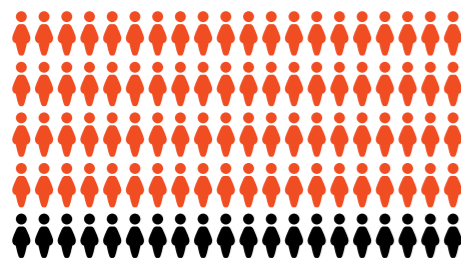
of the wage sum. Wages are only

1-2%

of the total price of a garment



There are over **4 million** garment workers in Bangladesh, at least **80%** are women



These workers and their families have **no access** to employment injury insurance



When will these promises become reality?



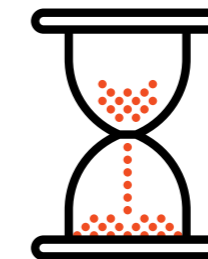
Since the Rana Plaza collapse in 2013, over

500

workers have been injured and more than

40

have been killed in garment factory incidents



These workers and families are **still waiting** for full and fair compensation

Less talk, more action

Brands and governments must fulfill promises of change and make employment injury insurance a reality in 2018

Workers and their families are waiting for full and fair compensation

8 Oct 2013 **7 workers killed** and **50 were injured** in a fire in the Aswad textile mill producing for **Primark, Next, C&A, H&M** and others

10 Sept 2016 at least **35 workers killed** in a fire in the Tampoco packaging factory, working for **Nestlé**

3 July 2017 **13 workers killed** and **47 injured** in a boiler explosion in Multifabs Ltd, producing for **Lindex, Aldi, Teddy** and others

9 Nov 2017 **1 worker killed** from burns sustained in a fire at Plummy Fashions, producing for **Lidl**

What needs to happen

Fall 2018 Employment injury insurance legislation tabled

Before end 2018 Bridging solution in place

Before June 2019 Employment injury implemented
